# PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID POSSIBLE EXPOSURE TO EXCESSIVE MICROWAVE ENERGY

- (a) Do not attempt to operate this oven with the door open since this can result in harmful exposure to microwave energy. It is important not to break or tamper with the safety interlocks.
- (b) Do not place any object between the oven front face and the door or allow soil or cleaner residue to accumulate on sealing surfaces.
- (c) WARNING: If the door or door seals are damaged, the oven must not be operated until it has been repaired by a competent person.

To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, injury to persons or exposure to excessive microwave oven energy when using your appliance, follow basic precautions, including the following:

- 1. Read and follow the specific: "PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID POSSIBLE EXPOSURE TO EXCESSIVE MICROWAVE ENERGY".
- 2. This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children unless they are older than 8 and supervised. - 7. WARNING: Liquids and other foods must not be heated in sealed containers since they are liable to explode.
- 8. When heating food in plastic or paper containers, keep an eye on the oven due to the possibility of ignition.
- 9. Only use utensils that are suitable for use in microwave ovens.
- 10. If smoke is emitted, switch off or unplug the appliance and keep the door closed in order to stifle any flames.
- 11. Microwave heating of beverages can result in delayed eruptive boiling, therefore care must be taken when handling the container.
- 12. The contents of feeding bottles and baby food jars shall be stirred or shaken and the temperature checked before consumption, in order to avoid burns.
- 13. Eggs in their shell and whole hard-boiled eggs should not be heated in microwave ovens since they may explode, even after microwave heating has ended.
- 14. The oven should be cleaned regularly and any food deposits removed.
- 15. Failure to maintain the oven in a clean condition could lead to deterioration of the surface that could adversely affect the life of the appliance and possibly result in a hazardous situation.

- 16. The appliance must not be installed behind a decorative door in order to avoid overheating. (This is not applicable for appliances with decorative door.)

- -by clients in hotels, motels and other residential type environments;

- 21. The microwave oven is intended for heating food and beverages. Drying of food or clothing and heating of warming pads, slippers, sponges, damp cloth and similar may lead to risk of injury, ignition or fire.
- 22. Metallic containers for food and beverages are not allowed during microwave cooking.
- 23. The appliance shall not be cleaned with a steam cleaner.
- 24. The appliance is intended to be used freestanding.
- 25. The rear surface of appliances shall be placed against a wall.

- A short power-supply cord is provided to reduce the risks resulting from becoming entangled in or tripping over a longer cord.
- 2. If a long cord set or extension cord is used:
  - 1)The marked electrical rating of the cord set or extension cord should be at least as great as the electrical rating of the appliance.
  - 2) The extension cord must be a grounding-type 3-wire cord.
  - 3)The long cord should be arranged so that it will not drape over the counter top or tabletop where it can be pulled on by children or tripped over unintentionally.

#### **CLEANING**

Be sure to unplug the appliance from the power supply.

- 1. Clean the cavity of the oven after using with a slightly damp cloth.
- 2. Clean the accessories in the usual way in soapy water.
- 3. The door frame and seal and neighbouring parts must be cleaned carefully with a damp cloth when they are dirty.
- 4. Do not use harsh abrasive cleaners or sharp metal scrapers to clean the oven door glass since they can scratch the surface, which may result in shattering of the glass.
- 5. Cleaning Tip---For easier cleaning of the cavity walls that the food cooked can touch: Place half a lemon in a bowl, add 300ml (1/2 pint) water and heat on 100% microwave power for 10 minutes. Wipe the oven clean using a soft, dry cloth.

It is hazardous for anyone other than a competent person to carry out any service or repair operation that involves the removal of a cover which gives protection against exposure to microwave energy.

See the instructions on "Materials you can use in microwave oven or to be avoided in microwave oven." There may be certain non-metallic utensils that are not safe to use for microwaving. If in doubt, you can test the utensil in question following the procedure below.

#### **Utensil Test:**

- 1. Fill a microwave-safe container with 1 cup of cold water (250ml) along with the utensil in question.
- 2. Cook on maximum power for 1 minute.
- 3. Carefully feel the utensil. If the empty utensil is warm, do not use it for microwave cooking.
- 4. Do not exceed 1 minute cooking time.

#### MATERIALS YOU CAN USE IN MICROWAVE OVEN

UTENSILS	REMARKS
Browning dish	Follow manufacturer's instructions. The bottom of browning dish must be
	at least 3/16 inch (5mm) above the turntable. Incorrect usage may cause the turntable to break.
Dinnerware	Microwave-safe only. Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.
Glass jars	Always remove lid. Use only to heat food until just warm. Most glass jars are not heat resistant and may break.
Glassware	Heat-resistant oven glassware only. Make sure there is no metallic trim. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.
Oven cooking bags	Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not close with metal tie. Make slits to allow steam to escape.
Paper plates and cups	Use for short–term cooking/warming only. Do not leave oven unattended while cooking.
Paper towels	Use to cover food for reheating and absorbing fat. Use with supervision for a short-term cooking only.
Parchment paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering or a wrap for steaming.
Plastic	Microwave-safe only. Follow the manufacturer's instructions. Should be labeled "Microwave Safe". Some plastic containers soften, as the food inside gets hot. "Boiling bags" and tightly closed plastic bags should be slit, pierced or vented as directed by package.
Plastic wrap	Microwave-safe only. Use to cover food during cooking to retain moisture. Do not allow plastic wrap to touch food.
Thermometers	Microwave-safe only (meat and candy thermometers).
Wax paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering and retain moisture.


#### MATERIALS TO BE AVOIDED IN MICROWAVE OVEN

UTENSILS	REMARKS
Aluminum tray Food carton with metal handle	May cause arcing. Transfer food into microwave-safe dish.  May cause arcing. Transfer food into microwave-safe dish.
Metal or metal- trimmed utensils	Metal shields the food from microwave energy. Metal trim may cause arcing.
Metal twist ties	May cause arcing and could cause a fire in the oven.
Paper bags	May cause a fire in the oven.
Plastic foam	Plastic foam may melt or contaminate the liquid inside when exposed to high temperature.
Wood	Wood will dry out when used in the microwave oven and may split or crack.

#### SETTING UP YOUR OVEN

#### NAMES OF OVEN PARTS AND ACCESSORIES

Remove the oven and all materials from the carton and oven cavity. Your oven comes with the following accessories:



#### Turntable Installation



- a. Never place the glass tray upside down. The glass tray should never be restricted.
- b. Both glass tray and turntable ring assembly must always be used during cooking.
- c. All food and containers of food are always placed on the glass tray for cooking.
- d. If glass tray or turntable ring assembly cracks or breaks, contact your nearest authorized service center.

#### SETTING UP YOUR OVEN


#### **COUNTERTOP INSTALLATION**

Remove all packing material and accessories. Examine the oven for any damage such as dents or broken door. DO not install if oven is damaged.

Cabinet: Remove any protective film found on the microwave oven cabinet surface. Do not remove the light brown Mica cover that is attached to the oven cavity to protect the magnetron.

#### Installation

1. Select a level surface that provide enough open space for the intake and/or outlet vents.



- (1) The minimum installation height is 85cm.
- (2) The rear surface of appliance shall be placed against a wall. Leave a minimum clearance of 30cm above the oven, a minimum clearance of 20cm is required between the oven and any adjacent walls.
- (3) Do not remove the legs from the bottom of the oven.
- (4) Blocking the intake and/ or outlet openings can damage the oven.
- (5) Place the oven as far away from radios and TV as possible. Operation of microwave oven may cause interference to your radio or TV reception.

#### SETTING UP YOUR OVEN

#### INSTALLATION

2.Plug your oven into a standard household outlet. Be sure the voltage and the frequency is the same as the voltage and the frequecy on the rating label.

#### **WARNING**

Do not install oven over a range cooktop or other heatproducing appliance. If installed near or over a heat source, the oven could be damaged and the warranty would be avoid.



The accessible surface may be hot during operation

#### 1. Clock Setting

When the microwave oven is electrified, the screen will display "0:00", buzzer will ring once.

- 1) Press "CLOCK/KITCHEN TIMER" twice to select clock function, the hour figures will flash.
- 2) Turn " " to adjust the hour figures, the input time should be within 0--23.
- 3) Press " START/+30SEC.", the minute figures will flash .
- 4) Turn " " to adjust the minute figures, the input time should be within 0--59.
- 5) Press "START/+30SEC. " to finish clock setting. ":" will flash, and the time will light.
- 6) If need to reset the clock, please repeat the step1 to step 5.

Note: 1) If the clock is not set, it would not function when powered.

2) During the process of clock setting, if you press " **STOP/CANCEL**" or if there is no operation in 1minute, the oven will go back to the previous status automatically.

#### 2. Microwave Cooking

Press "MICROWAVE" once, the screen will display "800w" and "00:00" is light. Press "MICROWAVE" repeatedly or turn " to choose the power you want, and "800w", "600w", "400w", "200w", "100w" will display for each added press. Then press "START/+30SEC." to confirm, and turn " to set cooking time from 0:05 to 95:00. Press "START/+30SEC." again to start cooking.

Example: If you want to use 600W microwave power to cook for 20 minutes, you can operate the oven as the following steps.

- 1) Press " MICROWAVE " once, the screen displays "800w".
- 2) Press "MICROWAVE " once again or turn " v to choose 600W microwave power.
- 3) Press " START/+30SEC. " to confirm, and the screen displays "600w".
- 4) Turn "  $\sqrt[n]{}$ " to adjust the cooking time until the oven displays "20:00".
- 5) Press "START/+30SEC." to start cooking.

Note: the step quantities for the adjustment time of the coding switch are as follow:

0---1 min : 5 seconds 1---5 min : 10 seconds 5---10 min : 30 seconds 10---30 min : 1 min ute 30---95 min : 5 minutes

#### 3. Grill or Combi. Cooking

Press "GRILL/COMBI" once, the screen will display "G". Press "GRILL/COMBI" repeatedly or turn " or to choose the power you want, and "G", "C-1". "C-2" will display for each added press. Then press "START/+30SEC." to confirm, and turn " or to set cooking time from 0:05 to 95:00. Press " START/+30SEC. " again to start cooking.

Example: If you want to use 55% microwave power and 45% grill power(C-1) to cook for 10 minutes, you can operate the oven as the following steps.

- 1) Press " GRILL/COMBI " once, the screen displays "G".
- 2) Press " GRILL/COMBI " for times or turn " to choose combi. 1 mode.
- 3) Press " START/+30SEC. " to confirm, and the screen displays "C-1".
- 5) Press " START/+30SEC." to start cooking.

#### 4. Quick Start

- 1) In multi-stage cooking state, each press of " **START/+30SEC.** " can increase 30 seconds cooking time. Defrosting stage cannot increase time.
- 2) In microwave, grill, combination cooking or time defrost state, each press of "START/+30SEC." can increase 30 seconds of cooking time.

#### 5. Defrost By Weight

- 1) Press "DEFROST" once, and "100" will flash to remind you input the defrost weight.
- 2) Turn "  $\mathbb{Q}_{h}$ " to select the weight of food from 100 to 1500 g.
- 3) Press " START/+30SEC. " to start defrosting.

#### 6. Defrost By Time

- 1) Press " **DEFROST** " twice, and the oven will display the defrost power "240w" and "00:00" will flash to remind you input the defrost time.
- 2) Turn " Turn to select the defrost time. The MAX time is 95 minutes.
- 3) Press " **START/+30SEC.** " to start defrosting. The defrost power cannot be changed.

#### 7. Kitchen Timer

- 1) Press " CLOCK/KITCHEN TIMER " once, the screen will display 00:00.
- 2) Turn "  $\begin{tabular}{ll} \begin{tabular}{ll} \begin{tabular$
- 3) Press " START/+30SEC. " to confirm setting.
- 4) When the kitchen time is reached, the buzzer will ring 5 times and "End" will display on the screen.

Note: 1) The inquiry of current time cannot work when the kitchen timer is working.

2) During the working of kitchen timer, press" **STOP/CANCEL** " can cancel the kitchen timer and the oven go back to waiting state.

#### 8. Auto Menu

- 1) Turn " right to choose the menu, and "A-1" to "A-12" will display.
- 2) Press " START/+30SEC. " to confirm.
- 3) Turn "  $\sqrt{}$ " to choose the default weight as the menu chart.
- 4) Press " START/+30SEC. " to start cooking.

Example: If you want to use "Auto Menu" to cook pasta for 100g.

- 1) Turn " clockwise till "A-6" displays.
- 2) Press " START/+30SEC. " to confirm.
- 3) Turn "  $\bigcirc$  " to select the weight of fish till "100" display s.
- 4) Press " START/+30SEC. " to start cooking.

#### 9. Multi-stage cooking

At most 2 sections can be set for cooking. In multi-stage cooking, if one section is defrosting, then defrosting shall be placed in the first section automatically.

Note: Kitchen timer and auto menu cannot work in multi-stage cooking. Quick start can be set as one of sections in multi-stage cooking.

Example: If you want to defrost food for 5 minutes and then cook with 80% microwave power for 7 minutes, operate it as the following:

- 1) Press "DEFROST" twice, and the oven will display "240w" and "00:00" will flash.
- 2) Turn "  $\bigcirc$  " to select the defrost time till "5:00" displays.
- 3) Press " MICROWAVE" once, the screen displays "800w".
- 4) Press " **MICROWAVE** " once again or turn " " to choose 80% microwave power.
- 5) Press " START/+30SEC. " to confirm, and the screen displays "600w".
- 6) Turn " or to adjust the cooking time till the oven displays "7:00".
- 7) Press "START/+30SEC." to start cooking, and buzzer will sound once for the first section, defrosting time counts down. Buzzer will sound once again entering the second cooking. When cooking finishes, buzzer sounds five times.

#### 10. Inquiring Function

In cooking state, press "CLOCK/KITCHEN TIMER" to inquire the time and the time will display for 3 seconds.

#### 11. Lock-out Function for Children

Lock: In waiting state, press " **STOP/CANCEL**" for 3 seconds, there will be a long beep denoting entering the children-lock state. The lock indicator will light and current time will display if the time has been set.

Lock quitting: In locked state, press "STOP/CANCEL" for 3 seconds, there will be a long "beep" denoting that the lock is released.

#### 12. Turntable Reset Function

When cooking finished, if the turntable is not at the initial position, it will enter the turntable reset function. At this time, the lamp, fan and turntable are working," <code>[::]</code> " will dynamic display. After the turntable has reset, the screen will display "End" to remind cooking is finished.

#### Note:

- This function only works for one completed cooking. If pause or open the oven door during cooking, the current cooking cannot enter the turntable reset function.
- 2. Under the reset state, opening the door or " STOP/CANCEL " button is pressed, the oven will go back to waiting state.
- 3. Position Precision: cooking time in 5 minutes and turntable degrees within the range of minus 30 degrees to 30 degrees.

#### TROUBLE SHOOTING

Normal		
Microwave oven interfering TV reception	Radio and TV reception may be interfered when microwave oven operating. It is similar to the interference of small electrical appliances, like mixer, vacuum cleaner, and electric fan. It is normal.	
Dim oven light	In low power microwave cooking, oven light may become dim. It is normal.	
Steam accumulating on door, hot air out of vents	In cooking, steam may come out of food. Most will get out from vents. But some may accumulate on cool place like oven door. It is normal.	
Oven started accidentally with no food in.	It is forbidden to run the unit without any food inside. It is very dangerous.	

Trouble	Possible Cause	Remedy
Oven can not be started.	(1) Power cord not plugged in tightly.	Unplug. Then plug again after 10 seconds.
	(2) Fuse blowing or circuit breaker works.	Replace fuse or reset circuit breaker (repaired by professional personnel of our company)
	(3) Trouble with outlet.	Test outlet with other electrical appliances.
Oven does not heat.	(4) Door not closed well.	Close door well.
